RE:

Aphonia and Augmentative and Alternative Communication Devices

The American Speech-Language-Hearing Association recommends that the Medicare list of diagnoses that indicate a need for evaluation of an Augmentative and Alternative Communication (AAC) device include aphonia. An AAC device would be considered for an individual with aphonia when a speech-language pathologist determines that the individual is not able to use natural communication, amplification devices, or an artificial larynx for daily communication needs.

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
